There was a very generous response to the call to support the food bank on Sunday, March 1. Two carts of donated food were wheeled into the Sanctuary, along with the Offertory. In addition, \$200 in cash was contributed.

In 2014, you donated \$3,700 for local food banks. This money was divided equally between North Helpline, Edmonds, Lynnwood and Mountlake Terrace. We all know there is great need for food assistance, and you can be sure your contributions are very gratefully received.

The first Sunday of the month is officially "Food Bank Sunday." However, you may contribute food and/or cash at any time during the month.



LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS & LESSONS

Continuing each Wednesday in Lent, March 18 and 25, there will be a supper of soup, salad and dessert at 6:30pm in the Parish Hall with teaching by either Eric Hanson or Fr. Bob Dunn to follow. "*The Creative Tension that We Face as We Live Out Our Lives as Christians and Episcopalians*" is the challenge that Fr. Bob and Eric will address in their lesson each Wednesday. The classes may change as we go along. This is intended to be a dynamic time when the conversations we have may influence the overall study. We begin with some working titles:

March 18 –The creative tension between a quiet and reflective style and a more verbal and outgoing style of being a church.

March 25 – The creative tension between a church with a lot of music and one where the worship is spoken only.

ALTAR GUILD MINISTRY

Altar Guild is a group of women who are dedicated to servicing our church, its congregation and our priest. Our primary responsibility is to insure the Sanctuary and the Lord's Table are properly prepared for services. Our duties include using the proper seasonal colors, linens are laundered and ready for use, candles maintained and silver and brass polished. Altar Guild also coordinates the flowers for services as donated and requested by members of the parish.

Altar Guild members are divided into four weekly teams of three each. We meet about eight times a year to plan and coordinate activities and insure the necessary supplies are available. We also gather for extra cleaning and preparation for special seasons, such as Lent/Easter and Advent/Christmas. We look to our priest for guidance and direction for all events and services.

Altar Guild is a sisterhood, and we share a special bond. We minister to each other with sharing, caring and prayer. We encourage all congregants to consider joining us. None of us are available for every duty week or meeting, so please don't let travel plans or other obligations deter your joining us. The only requirement is that members be confirmed in the Episcopal Church. Check with Karen Ford or Judy Kistner with questions.



SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN & SAFEGUARDING GOD'S PEOPLE

The Episcopal Church Nationally has made a positive response to the growing concern for sexual issues in the church, both in protection of our children and our older members. The Diocese of Olympia is making two training opportunities available as a part of this national response. They are "Safeguarding God's Children" and "Safeguarding God's People."

The two trainings are very important for anyone who has contact with children at church, as well as shut-ins or persons in hospital or nursing/retirement homes. They are also important for anyone in a leadership role at the church. There is an online version available for parents; however the "in person" version is required for those who will participate in these ministries at the church or on behalf of the church.

The training is most often offered on Saturdays at various churches in the Diocese. Thanks to Karen Ford and Dan Mullene, St. Alban's has arranged for both trainings to be offered **here on Saturday, May 2**. You will never find these offered closer to home, so I am hopeful that many from this congregation will take advantage of this day.

The training does require advance registration, and you will receive a certificate that is good for five years. The training will be open to others in the Diocese. Watch for further information about registration, and add this training session to your calendar.
