The Vestry met last Monday for our monthly meeting. Here's some of the work we did.

Business. We approved several business-oriented motions at this meeting, most of which were in preparation for the new Vestry coming in after the Annual Meeting. These include reappointing Dan Mullene and Jim Gilman as our parish Almoners (those who have access to the Discretionary Funds and assist in helping those in need); approving a Vestry Liaison Job Description; approving a By-law amendment to present at the Annual Meeting; and lastly reviewing the Christmas Eve service, *A Christmas Carol*, radio play, and Kay McLellan's Retirement Celebration.

Annual Meeting, February 4. We discussed our Annual Meeting, which is scheduled for February 4. There will be one worship service that day, at 9:30am. As part of the service we will formally welcome our new members into the congregation. And there will be a short pre-worship Coffee Hour at 9:00am.

Immediately after the service, we will have lunch and the meeting will begin at 11:15am. You can expect to hear some reports, learn about new programs, be presented with our 2024 Budget, and vote for our next Vestry. We will be done by 1:00pm.

**2024 Budget.** We approved next year's Budget. This is the culmination of a process that has taken several months. As mentioned above, the budget will be presented at the Annual Meeting.

<u>Discernment Meeting</u>. We decided to reintroduce a Discernment Meeting for those considering running for Vestry and for Diocesan Convention Delegates. The meeting will be held this Sunday, January 21, in the Annex, after the 10:30am service, from 12:30 – 2:30pm.

## **DAY BY DAY REFLECTIONS**

The following reflection is from Forward Movements' 2016 publication, "Forward Through the Years," a collection of the timeless wisdom offered over the years from various clergy and non-clergy. This writing is from 1996, author unknown.

Ephesians 5:2 – Live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

When people meet you, God longs for them also to meet Christ. It sounds like a very high expectation, and quite beyond us, beyond even our best imaginings on our best days. Nevertheless, it is what God longs to see happen. God longs for us to live so that in us others will recognize and be touched by the love of Christ.

When the writer of the letter to the Ephesians tells his readers to "live in love" he is really talking about that divine hope. To live in love is to be an advertisement for God. To act with decisive selflessness, even in a small way, is to reflect nothing less than the brilliant reality of the God who meets us in Christ.

Every step you take in love represents the purposes of God. It may be a small step—a minor kindness, a tiny sacrifice, a spontaneous act of mercy—but every step walked in love is evidence of the presence of God in the world. Moreover, it is a step along the road toward your truest self, the self made in the image of Christ, the self God made and means for you to be.

#### JANUARY 21– EPIPHANY 3

In the calling of the fishermen, what word is repeated to indicate their enthusiasm? Immediately! Are we in the habit of responding to God's call to us immediately or is our answer "maybe some time I can become your diligent and faithful follower, but right now \_\_\_\_ (you fill in the blank) is much more important." Where

would the Church be today if the disciples and the many faithful who came after, had made such a response.

#### JANUARY 28 - EPIPHANY 4

Psalm 11:1 says, "I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart..." Our Catechism (see Prayer Book, p. 856) has at least one set of suggestions about how to do this. We are to follow Christ, to come together week by week for corporate worship, and to work, pray, and give for the spread of his kingdom. What a concise list for a "steward-in-training"!
