

THE SUNDAY PAPER YEAR 6 TRINITY SUNDAY

This Sunday is TRINITY SUNDAY. It is a special day in the Church's year. Most of the special days in the Church's year celebrate something that happened in Jesus's life. But TRINITY SUNDAY is different. It celebrates an idea. It celebrates an important idea about God.

When we talk about God in church, we often use the words, "FATHER, SON and HOLY SPIRIT." We use these three names for God together, because we know God in these three ways.



First, we know that God made the world, and cares for it. We know that we are God's children. Jesus taught us to call God our FATHER.

Then, we know that God came into the world. Jesus, God's WORD, came to show us what God is like, so we could see him and love him. He came to share our life and our death. Jesus is God's SON.

And we know God is in the world and in our hearts always. We call that the HOLY SPIRIT.

"TRINITY" means "three-ness." God is three selves, joined into one by love, "three in one and one in three!"

ROMANS 5:1-5 Jesus is our way to God
 "Jesus has given us God's love, which is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit"

JOHN 16:12-15 Jesus makes known the Father
 Jesus says, "The Father has sent me to you, and the Spirit will be your guide"
