The Vestry had two meetings this month. On Sunday, December 7, we met at Pine Ridge Post Acute Care facility, where Shirley Clark is recovering from her broken arm. This was the first time the Vestry has had a Christmas Party in the eight years that I've been here. I'm not sure why it has taken so long to organize this, but it won't be the last. We had a great time, doing no business at all. It was wonderful to spend time with Shirley. Her recovery and healing have been slow but steady and she was in fine spirits at the party.

Then last Sunday, December 14, we met for our monthly business meeting.

One of the first things we discussed was our **Budget Deficit**. As you will remember, last January, we passed our Annual Budget with a \$20,000 deficit. Although our projected income did not match the basic needs of our operating budget, we had hoped that our pledge base would increase and that people would once again prove to be generous at the end of the year thereby closing the deficit. And thanks to wise and prudent planning, we have \$60,000 in reserve to compensate for end of the year operating fund deficits.

(Parenthetically, Budget Reserve Fund was established several years ago from a bequest after Marjorie Garrard's death. We have utilized that fund very sparingly over the years, and our protocol calls for using a maximum of 1/3 of it in any given year, so we still hold in reserve nearly the full amount that Margorie bequeathed us. Still, we would rather use as little of that fund as possible.)

Over the course of the year, our pledges and other income have been right on track. As a congregation, we have been quite frugal with our expenses. (Presently we are \$6,000 under budget for expenses. Well done!) However, we still have a significant budget deficit. So, we ask that congregation members please consider making a special end of the year gift to our church to help close the budget gap.

Along the same lines, we took an initial look at our

preliminary **2026 Budget**. As with past years, this is again a pretty bare bones budget. We note that many other non-profit organizations face similar budget quandaries. It seems that we have not fully recovered from the economic impacts of the Pandemic. We will make our final adjustments to the 2026 Budget, approve it at our January meeting, and present it to the congregation at the Annual Meeting.

Looking at the results of our recent **Annual Pledge** and **Stewardship Drive**, we were pleased to have received 48 pledges totaling \$139,520 for next year. Of those pledges, five are new this year with a \$7,000 increase over last year.

The Nominations Committee is recruiting parishioners to serve on Vestry and as Delegates to Diocesan Convention. We have four vestry seats to fill for next year and currently have two people willing to run for election at our Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, February 1, 2026. The committee continues its work and asks fellow parishioners to prayerfully consider serving on vestry or representing our congregation at convention. If you would like to know more about how the vestry operates, members' responsibilities, and the general demeanor and tenor of our meetings, please talk with a vestry member.

At our November meeting, we approved the installation of four **Security Cameras** to address concerns about vandalism to the Blessings Pantry and the Preschool's playground equipment. These acts of vandalism primarily occurred last summer but have also occurred at other seemingly random times. The cameras are intended to deter this behavior. They were installed last week.

Lastly, we were pleased that our Christmas Concert benefiting Chase Lake Community School raised \$150. It was observed that, although this event was pretty hastily organized and the amount raised not huge, this concert can serve as a model blueprint for events to come. The concert brought in music students from Edmonds-Woodway High School and benefited the students and families of Chase Lake School. We are located right between these schools. The audience was mainly St. Alban's parishioners but there were community members in attendance as well. We have established a relationship with the High School music program, giving the musicians a venue to play in front of live audience outside of their norm. Many foundational community connections were made. We intend to build on these relationships.

We are so thankful to all you who helped make this concert a success!

# TREASURER'S REPORT – November 2025

In November, St. Alban's reported total income of \$24,987.56, bringing year-to-date income to \$176,864.40, which is ahead of the budgeted YTD income of \$171,035. This continued generosity from the congregation has helped sustain our ministries and operations as we move toward year end.

Monthly expenses for November totaled \$14,641.96, and year-to-date expenses stand at \$192,370, which is below the budgeted YTD

**expenses of \$198,168**. Overall, our expenses remain well-managed and continue to track under budget.

While income is currently ahead of projections and expenses remain below budget, it is important to remember that **our annual budget includes a planned deficit**, and we rely on strong year-end giving to close the gap. As always, we are grateful for the faithful financial support of the St. Alban's community.



### EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT PLAQUE

The Vestry approved funds to create a plaque to commemorate the Eagle Scout projects done at St. Alban's. Bill Hecox from Troop 300 helped Phil McClelland locate the dates and people that did each project. This plaque is hung in the Parish Hall. Be sure to take a look at it. # ST. ALBAN'S END OF YEAR OUTREACH

Thanks to your generosity, St. Alban's has made several gifts during December.

- We were able to send \$950 to each of the local food banks: Edmonds, Mountlake Terrace and Lynnwood with contributions we have made in the 1st Week Basket since August.
- We also sent \$2,300 to WomenSpirit Coalition for contributions to the 5<sup>th</sup> Week Basket since April.
- We sent \$140 to Mission to Seafarers from cash donations in addition to the personal items we donated.
- We sent \$96 to Refugee Resettlement Organization/Diocese of Olympia from our Thanksgiving Eve donations.
- We are sending \$413 to the Diocese to work with Episcopal Relief & Development for Western Washington flood relief efforts.
